Alcoholics Anonymous Bible Study in Salem, Massachusetts

So.... One day I was conversing with one of our Bible study group members. I said, "Bro. Matthew, let's establish an AA meeting group in Salem, MA!"

Bro. Matthew, a senior member of an AA group outside Salem, surprised yet eager asked; "Pastor, are you sure?" "Of course, let us plant this seed and see what happens." Our main focus in these sessions will not be about the 12 steps of the "Big Book" study but to teach and provide the necessary tools for willing individuals to create and establish their own Bible Study group for the benefit of other AA members.

In June 6, 2017 at our church fellowship hall, we started this group for newcomers and old-timers alike. We envisioned a group based on and guided by the three AA legacies: Recovery - a clear presentation of the AA program by speakers from all walks of life and cultures of AA fellowship, including the encouragement of sponsorship; Unity - a cohesive fellowship on which nobody has to be alone or excluded, where all are welcome and assistance is available to anyone who wants it; Service - to be an active and informed voice in the AA circles of love and service.

Initially, all the jobs were done by only the two of us, but soon, some of our sponsors and friends began cooperating with us, enhancing our capability of assisting individuals in need exponentially. Because of their commitments, 27 AA members are now currently attending our Salem group on a regular basis and the numbers will continue to grow from there.

Later, the group was encouraged to join our ongoing Bible study programs (Lighthouses). This portrayed the dramatic change that has taken in place within the zeal of its members to form a relationship with God, to come to Him through Jesus Christ, to study the Bible rather than merely relying on "High Power."

In result, many members were convinced that they needed to be delivered. They need to be inspired to change their life in order for them to

gain the initiative to "do God's will." They need to know the importance of God and His Word to enjoy the abundant life the Creator promised to those who seek Him through His Son Jesus Christ.

Not My Battle

A mighty general once came before his king to give a report of what went on in the battlefield.

- "Your enemies from the north are defeated, O king," he said.
- "Very good," said the king.
- "And your enemies from the south are defeated," he continued.
- "Very good," said the king.
- "And your enemies from the west are also defeated," he proudly announced.
- "Even better," said the king.
- "And finally, your enemies from the east are defeated," he said.
- "East? I don't have enemies from the east," said the king.
- "Well," said the general, "I guess you do now."

Isn't it interesting how we often get ourselves and others in trouble simply because we go about fighting battles that do not belong to us? Sometimes in life, the best thing to do is to mind your own business and take care of your own responsibilities. Nosiness, as you may have discovered, can be disastrous.

This can be difficult too because conflict surrounds us all the time and it is not easy to determine which ones deserves our attention. Conversely, we may be so unaware of the conflicts other people face that we end up becoming apathetic towards their struggles. Theologian Ian Maclaren wisely said, "Be kind, for everyone you meet is fighting a hard battle."

In 2 Chronicles 20, King Jehoshaphat and his people are met with a challenge. The Moabites, Ammonites, and Meunites have just declared war against them. As a result, Jehoshaphat was "terrified by this news and begged the LORD for guidance" (2 Chron. 20:3). With this, the King called for a solemn assembly, a time for fasting and prayer. It was then that the Spirit of the Lord came upon a Levite named Jahaziel. He spoke with boldness and declared,

Listen, all you people of Judah and Jerusalem! Listen, King Jehoshaphat! This is what the LORD says: Do not be afraid! Don't be discouraged by this mighty army, for the battle is not yours, but God's. Tomorrow, march out against them. You will find them coming up through the ascent of Ziz at the end of the valley that opens into the wilderness of Jeruel. But you will not even need to fight. Take your positions; then stand still and watch the LORD's victory. He is with you, O people of Judah and Jerusalem. Do not be afraid or discouraged. Go out against them tomorrow, for the LORD is with you! (vv. 15-17)

Did you hear that? He said, "The battle is not yours, but God's." So if it was God's, then this battle was not theirs to fight. All they had to do was take their positions, proclaim the greatness of God in worship, and then watch the Lord fight the battle that belonged to Him, and Him alone.

As the people of God stood in worship, something amazing happened,

Make Them Come Back To Your Church

We all have church events and activities that were designed to attract visitors with the hope that they find a community of faith that they can commit to. Whether it's a Vacation Bible School for children – where we invite visiting family and friends to volunteer and enjoy – or, an Easter Cantata that draws them in with prayerful and inspiring musical presentations; or even a Church Anniversary celebration – where they can hopefully find a featured ministry or small group they can be a part of - we design these programs with the goal of inviting them towards involvement and possible commitment to our faith community. If they get involved and commit... that's a "win" (pun intended), at least in our scorecard.

Consider these two surveys (one formal poll and another informal survey):

- (1) An **April 2017 Gallup Poll** that asked Americans about the major factors "why they attend church or a place of worship"; and,
- (2) A January 2017 Twitter Survey by Pastor Thom Rainier (President and CEO of LifeWay Christian Resources) that asked "what was the singular event that made them desire to return to church". The results will delight many pastors and hopefully encourage us to make some necessary adjustments.

The Gallup Poll suggests that three out of four churchgoers in America attend church because of the **content of the sermon** (75% go to church to hear "sermons relevant to my life", also, 76% go to church to hear "sermons that are based on Scripture"). This is to the humble delight of any preacher of the Word! While it encourages the preacher to **present sermons** that are biblical yet relevant, it also assures them that their tireless efforts in sermon preparation are valued by churchgoers (whether they say it or not)! If you're a pastor/preacher – way to go! If you're a church-goer, make sure to send a word of encouragement to your pastor/preacher about the impact and importance of what he/she does.

Secondly, Rainier's Twitter survey developed around <u>nine (9) factors</u> that answered the question "What made you come back to church?". He summarizes each factor with a quote that best illustrates each: (comments in red are mine)


- "Someone had an umbrella waiting for me in inclement weather." (an ushering/greeting/valet-parking ministry that is outside the church building!)
- "A member actually invited me to lunch." (someone befriended them and was genuinely interested in them!)
- "The kids area had leaders who were friendly and helpful." (highlighting the importance
 of a children's program and child-friendly facility)

At the very moment they began to sing and give praise, the LORD caused the armies of Ammon, Moab, and Mount Seir to start fighting among themselves. The armies of Moab and Ammon turned against their allies from Mount Seir and killed every one of them. After they had destroyed the army of Seir, they began attacking each other. So when the army of Judah arrived at the lookout point in the wilderness, all they saw were dead bodies lying on the ground as far as they could see. Not a single one of the enemy had escaped. (vv.22-24)

Everyday we are tempted to fight battles. But could it be that we are needlessly fighting battles that don't belong us? Our King Jesus fought and won the ultimate battle over sin and death through Calvary's Cross. In him, we are given the grace to live in victory and the freedom to declare his praises among the nations.

- 4. "There was a time of meaningful prayer." (the importance of leading people to a time of connecting to God in prayer)
- **5.** "Someone walked us where we were supposed to go." (guests and first-timers need to be gently guided into where they should go, it lessens stress!)
- 6. "There was genuine friendliness outside of the stand and greet time." (they were properly introduced to others, helps overcome the awkwardness)
- 7. "People followed up with my prayer requests the next day." (they will feel genuinely cared for, and an opportunity to follow-up as well!)
- 8. "I loved having the opportunity to speak with the pastor." (whether before or after the service or even during the greeting portion of the service)
- 9. "I received a gift at the end of the service." (Don't we all just love receiving gifts!)

So before your core-group or your leadership community launches into another "back-to-church" campaign this Fall, consider these survey responses first. I am sure that many of our WIN-USA churches are practicing most, if not all, of

these already (including the biblically-centered, relevant preaching!). But, just in case there are those two or three areas of improvement that you observe in your church, then I would've done my part for this article.
