The Prayer of the Righteous

Prayer is our means to connect with God the Father, to talk to Him, to present our petitions, to listen to His voice, to make requests for personal and love ones, and many others. These requests could be prosperity, healing, peace, protection, wisdom, strength, and innumerable blessing for ourselves, family, relatives, church, friends, enemies, leaders, nations, and the whole world. As we pray, we quote the most popular promise of Jesus that says, "Most assuredly I say to you, whatever you ask the Father in My name He will give you" (John 16:23).

However, many of us find that our experience fails to live up to that promise. Many people wish that they receive more answers to their prayers. In fact, we who believe in the power of prayer still want to be more effective in our prayers and personal devotion to God. However, some times, all of us wondered that God did not answer our prayer. We know God hears us, but we are not seeing real results. Maybe we are not sure if God hears our prayers at all. In this article, let us make a short survey of the Bible and try to find the most "ignored" and "overlooked" key to answered prayer.

Scattered in the pages of the Bible are examples of God answering prayers. When God is ready to wipe out Israel for their sin and unbelief, Moses prayed and God listened and answered his prayer (Exo. 32:7-14). When Elijah prayed that it might not rain, God answered his prayer that He did not send rain on the earth for three and a-half years (1 Kings 17; James 5:17). When Jehoshaphat declared prayer and fasting for fear that the invading enemies from Moab and Ammon will annihilate his people, God answered his prayer (2 Chr. 20). These individuals were ordinary men, imperfect and weak people like us, yet their prayers had changed the mind of God to fulfill His plan. Their prayers transformed the course of history and they got real results.

Recently, we hear lots of bad news in television and internet. Killing, shooting, violence, natural calamities,

wars, rumors of wars, politicking, and others. We hear the president and political leaders expressing their condolences and calls for prayer, particularly after the crises and calamities hit. Religious leaders and business people are uttering prayers saying; "Our thoughts and prayers are with you!" "Our prayers go out to the victim of such and such tragedies." People hold prayer vigils, seek to commune with God when terror strikes, or illness afflicts the loved one, especially during the last pandemic crisis. Despite that, do these prayers make any difference? Did God listen to the prayers and consolations? Many people today believe that the answer is, maybe no! In a secular world, more people even mock the idea of prayer.

The Bible teaches that the effective, fervent prayer of a righteous man avails much; the prayer of faith will save the sick, we must be bold in prayer, we must be energetic while praying, we must remember the history of God's faithfulness, we must study the promises of God in the Bible, we must know His desires to bless us, we must hold Him to His promises, we must pray according to His will, we must pray using the name of Jesus, we must be diligent, we must put in hard work, we must pray the most important part each day. Nevertheless, we can do and quote all these prayer verses and not receive real results! Why? Well, probably none of these is the most "ignored" and "overlooked" key to answered prayer! Maybe we are missing something that will genuinely change our knowledge and understanding about prayer.

When the Lord revealed to Noah that He would destroy the earth because of the sins, He commanded him to build an ark. The Bible said that Noah did everything exactly as God had commanded him (Gen 6:22). When the rain began to fall, God spoke again to go inside the ark and bring all the animals along. Noah did according to all that the Lord commanded him (Gen 7:5). Noah obeyed

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God accordingly! When the Lord revealed to Abraham that his descendant shall be as many as the stars in heaven, the Bible said that Abraham believed and that made him righteous with God (Gen 15:6). But Abraham also obeyed when God tested his faith and told him to offer his son Isaac in the land of Moriah (Gen 22:1-5). Abraham believed the promise but he has to show his faith unto the Lord by means of obedience. Abraham did obey the Lord accordingly!

In the time of Moses, he was told by God to make the tabernacle as a symbol of God's presence in the midst of His people. The Lord told Moses to see to it that he makes the tabernacle according to the patterns which was shown him on the mountain (Exo 25:9, 40, 26:30, Num 8:4). Moses and the Israelites made all the utensils to be used for the rituals, and constructed the tabernacle exactly similar according to the words of the Lord. When David became king of Israel, he decided to bring the ark of the covenant from Shiloh to Jerusalem. He also planned to build a house of God, a temple that would stand permanently in the City of David (2 Sam 7). With this intention, the Lord was impressed by the heart and action of David because of His willingness to do and sacrifice for the sake of his God.

When God sent King Saul for a mission, he was commissioned to destroy and kill all Amalekites, men and women, child and babies, including animals. Saul has to do it because of what Amalek did to Israel in standing against them on the way, when they came up from Egypt (1 Sam 15). Saul obeyed the voice of the Lord, but he obeyed partially not accordingly. Instead of killing all, Saul spared king Agag and the best of the sheep, the cattle, the fat animals, the lambs, and all that was good. They only destroyed everything that was hated and was of no worth. God, through prophet Samuel accused Saul of disobeying God's command, but Saul refused and declared that he did obey God's command. Consequently, Saul lost his throne, and David became the new anointed king. But this was not the first time for Saul to disobey God's voice, this one was the climax of all his previous disobedience.

Obedience matters most to God. Obedience is better than sacrifice. Prayers, animal sacrifices, all sacrifices in church ministries, singing and dancing on Sunday services are less significant when there is disobedience in the hearts of God's people. Many believers don't realize that obedience is the key, something that we often "ignored" and "overlooked" when we pray and present petitions to God. We must not only pray, but we must also desire to obey God, and actually obey His will. What did the Lord tell Noah, Abraham, Moses, Samuel, David, Elijah, Paul and other men of prayer that they need to do? Simple, they must obey God's command accordingly.

Loving God is not simply saying "I love You, Lord!" Jesus told his disciples, saying, "If you love Me, obey my commands" (John 14:15). "If you obey My teaching, you will live in My love" (John 15:10). The Lord knew the Bible, He knew the will of God, and He instructed His disciple to know and follow His way. Obeying God means giving up one's will and doing God's will instead. Many Christians don't realize or admit this, but most of the time, our will is contrary to the will of God. This doesn't just apply to nonbelievers, but to the people of God as well.

So, what is the prayer of the righteous? Well, "prayer as usual," but never ignore the importance of obedience to the will of God. The book of Psalms, Tehilim in Hebrew, is a book of prayer of the Jewish people. When you see a Jewish guy in a bus, train, plane, or any place reading a pocket book with big Hebrew letters written in it, it is a prayer book, but actually book of Psalms. Here, we can discover many prayers of David asking God to help him obey His will. "Open my eyes that I may see your wondrous things from Your law; Give me understanding and I shall keep Your law; Help me that I shall observe it with my whole heart; Help me that I may learn your commandments; Empower me that I may know your testimonies, according to your words."

Lastly, we are all struggling in our prayer life. There is no formula on how to pray. The major thing is to search the Bible for God's will and His promises. But stop playing fire with God, and then faithfully believe His promises even though it is beyond your comprehension. Not only will you get the real results, but you will know as you are praying that God always answer our prayers. You may not know how or when, but you know that He answers when you pray.
